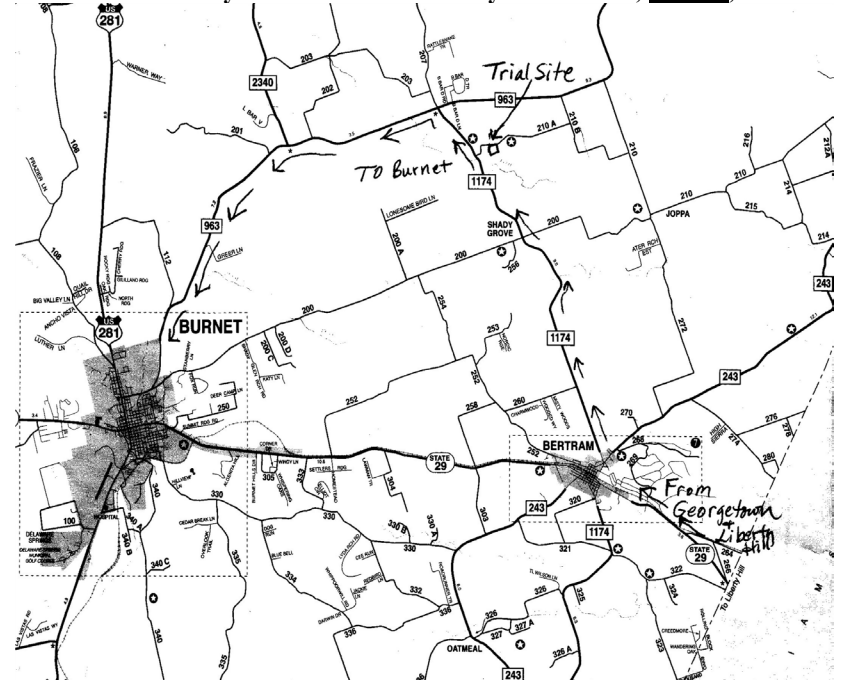

Directions to the Trial Site (From the east at IH 35 at Georgetown)
(Towns in order along Hwy. 29 heading west from Georgetown: Liberty Hill, Bertram, Burnet)

Take Hwy 29 to Bertram. In the middle of town at the only signal light, turn North (right) onto RR 243/RR1174 also called Grange Street. Go 4/10 of a mile and turn left onto RR 1174 North. Go 7.6 miles and turn right onto County Road 210A. Go 6/10 mile. The road curves to the left and then to the right. We are the second property on the right at 601 County Road 210A, Destiny Farm. **Please keep gate closed.**

Notice to Exhibitors

- I. **Entry fees will not be refunded** in the event that a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by action of the veterinarian, judge, or Trial Committee.
- II. **Entry fees will not be refunded** if the trials cannot be opened or completed by reason of riots, civil disturbance, fire, an act of God, public emergency, an act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee.
- III. **Lame dog policy**: If a dog is found to be physically unable to participate in the trial after the closing date, that dog may qualify for a refund in one of two ways. 1) If the trial is full and there is a wait list, and the owner/handler of the injured dog notifies the Trial Secretary at least 24 hours prior to the start of the Sunday trial, the first dog on the wait list that fits the stock availability and can be in attendance, will secure a place in the trial for no more than the number of runs the injured dog had entered, and the injured dog will receive a full refund. If no one on wait list fits the stock availability and/or can be in attendance, no refund will be given. 2) If the trial is not full, all entry fees will be refunded minus any recording fees due. In this case, a veterinarian's certificate MUST be submitted prior to 8:00am the day of the trial.
- IV. It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create unnecessary disturbances or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the Trial Committee, be asked to leave the trial site. In that case, no refund of any fees paid will be made.
- V. No refunds for duplicate entries. However, care will be taken to find duplicates before processing. Owners are responsible for errors in making out entry forms and no entry fee will be refunded in the event of such errors.
- VI. Checks that have been returned due to insufficient funds do not constitute a valid entry and will have a \$25.00 service charge attached.
- VII. Checks that have been post-dated do not constitute a valid entry.
- VIII. Exhibitors should follow their veterinarians' recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable diseases, and have appropriate vaccinations.
- IX. Destiny Farm reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression, disease, deformity, injury or illness which may affect the dogs' physical or mental performance. No one shall have any recourse or claim against Destiny Farm or any official thereof.

Destiny Farm does not agree to arbitrate claims as set forth on the official entry form for this event.

Eligibility

1. The Trial Program and Junior Herding Dog Program are open to all dogs 9 months of age or older. The Herding Capability Test Program is open to herding breeds and multipurpose breeds with herding background on the list at the end of the Test Program rules, six months of age and older.
2. Spayed bitches and neutered dogs may participate.
3. Bitches in heat may take part. In trial classes, bitches in heat need not wait until all other dogs have participated. In test classes, bitches in heat must wait until all other dogs have participated.
4. Dogs must be sound and in good health. Any dog which appears to be unfit will be removed at the judge's discretion; examples are: lameness, injury, illness, advanced pregnancy.
5. Owners of participating dogs need not be members of any club or organization.
6. A dog owned or co-owned by the judge or any member of the judge's immediate family or household may not be evaluated by that judge, nor may a judge evaluate a dog of which that judge has been the owner, co-owner or primary trainer/handler within the last six months.

Note

No dog may be entered in two classes on the same course with the same kind of stock under the same judge at any trial.

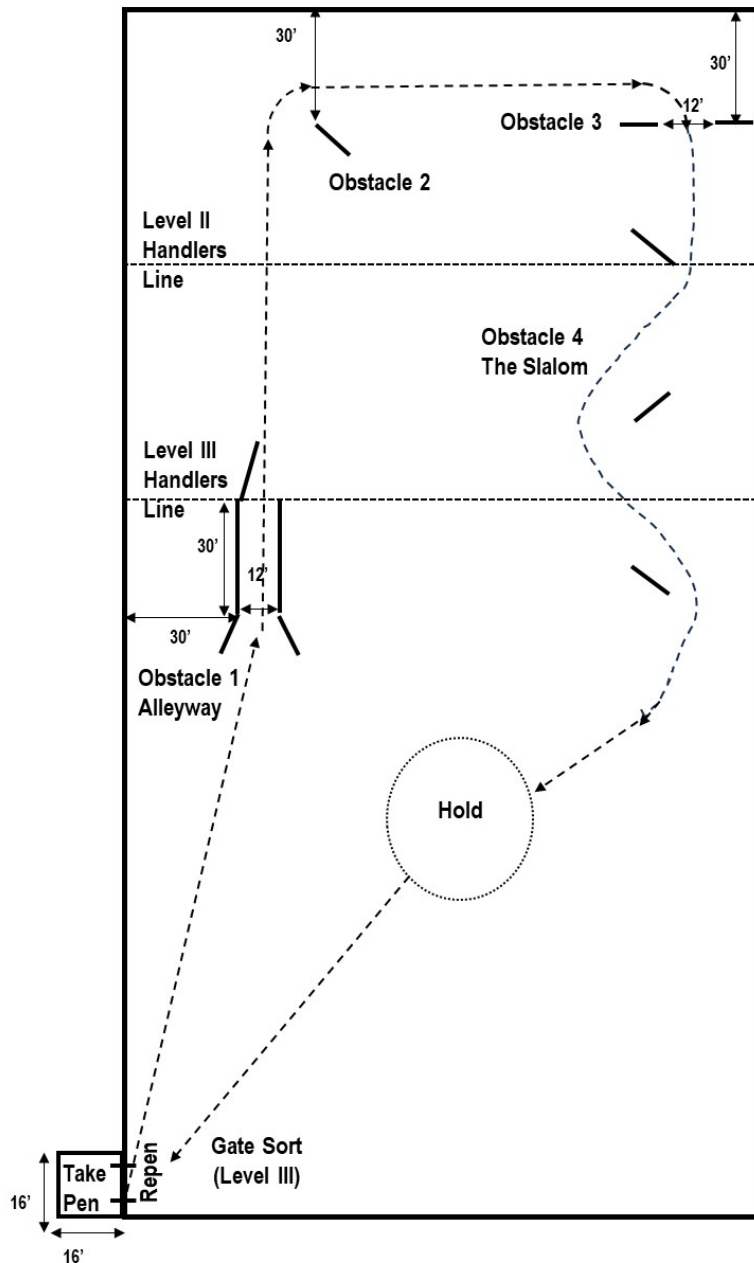
A dog must be entered in the name of the person(s) who actually owns it at the time entries are made for the Herding Test or Trial.

A Registration or Tracking Number must be included. Use your dog's registration number to enter. If your dog is not registered with any registry, then obtain a tracking number using the form on the AHBA website.

AHBA HTAD COURSE #5



Tie Breaker: Best Take Pen, then best Repen, then Time

A Take Pen is used instead of a set out.

Course Time for HTAD I and II is 10 minutes. HTAD III is 12 minutes.

Time starts when the gate for the take pen is opened. In all three classes, the lead is removed before the handler opens the take pen gate.

All panels are 10' long.

Obstacle I Alleyway chute is located off the West fence, with the entrance built approximately 30' south from the midpoint of the arena and 30' off the west side of the arena. The alleyway obstacle has a 12 ft. opening with two opposite wings at the entrance. A gate is attached at the end of the Alleyway. Obstacle 2 is located on a diagonal line in the Northwest corner approximately 40' from the West fence at the top corner of the panel and 30' from the North fence at the top corner of the panel. The panel diagonals to the southeast. Obstacle 3 is a two panel obstacle and is located in the North East corner parallel to the North fence 30' south from the North Fence. The second panel is perpendicular to the East fence and is located on the East fence. The opening is 10' wide. Obstacle 4 is a 3 series of single panels in the shape of a slalom and is located approximately 40 ft. from the East fence heading south in opposing diagonals. Panels are 12' apart. The hold area is located approximately just south of the center line of the arena. The gate sort is located at the repen gate for Level III. For poultry, all dimensions are ½ that for hooved stock.

1. Take Pen: HTAD III handlers must remain outside the pen while the dog brings out the stock. HTAD II handlers may enter the pen with the dog but should not move the stock themselves. HTAD I handlers may enter the pen and assist the dog in moving the stock. If the stock come out on their own volition without the handler or dog entering, there is no penalty. Once the gate to the take pen is opened, it may not be closed until the stock have exited. The stock are then taken toward

Obstacle 1. Scoring for the take pen ends when the stock have gone to the midpoint toward Obstacle 1.

2. Obstacle 1: The stock should enter between the two wings at the opening of the alleyway. At the end of the Alleyway, the stock reach the closed gate. Handler will then open gate and stock then exit the alleyway toward Obstacle 2. Handler must close gate before proceeding to Obstacle 2. HTAD III handlers must remain no closer than 10' from the entrance as the stock enter the alleyway and remain there until stock reach the back gate of the alley. HTAD II handlers may go up to the wing panel but may not move past the wing until the stock have reached near the back gate. HTAD I handlers may move anywhere relative to the obstacle but may not enter it. All Handlers move to end of Alleyway to open gate to let stock exit and then must close gate after last stock have exited. Scoring for Obstacle 1 ends when the animals have exited. Drive: After the stock exit Obstacle 1, they are moved toward the North off the East fence going toward Obstacle 2. HTAD III handlers must remain behind the handler's line which is the exit of Obstacle 1. HTAD II handlers may accompany the stock to the Level II handler's line to Obstacle 2, then must remain there for the rest of the drive. HTAD I handlers may accompany the stock up to Obstacle 2 but cannot go through obstacle. The drive ends when the stock reach a point 10 ft. in front of Obstacle 2.

3. Obstacle 2: The handlers remain at the designated locations while the stock are taken/driven around and to the left of the freestanding panel. While HTAD I handlers may go up to the panel, they should not precede the stock through the panel. Once the stock have gone around to the back of the panel, handlers are free to move along their handlers line except for Level I handlers who can move anywhere.

3. Obstacle 3: The stock are turned/driven to the East to Obstacle 3 along the North fence and then turned/driven to the South to enter Obstacle 3. Handlers remain behind their Handler's line except for HTAD I handlers who can move anywhere. Scoring for Obstacle 3 ends when the stock have exited the Obstacle.

4. Obstacle 4 (Slalom): The stock are taken South through a series of 3 single panels at opposing diagonals to weave in and out of like a

slalom. For the first panel, the stock should be moved to the east of the first panel and then headed between the first and second panel toward the west. The stock are then headed through to the east between the second and third panel and around to the east of panel 3. Scoring for the Slalom ends after the last head of stock pass to the south and west of panel 3. All Handlers can move to any position relative of the obstacles but may not go through the 3 panels.

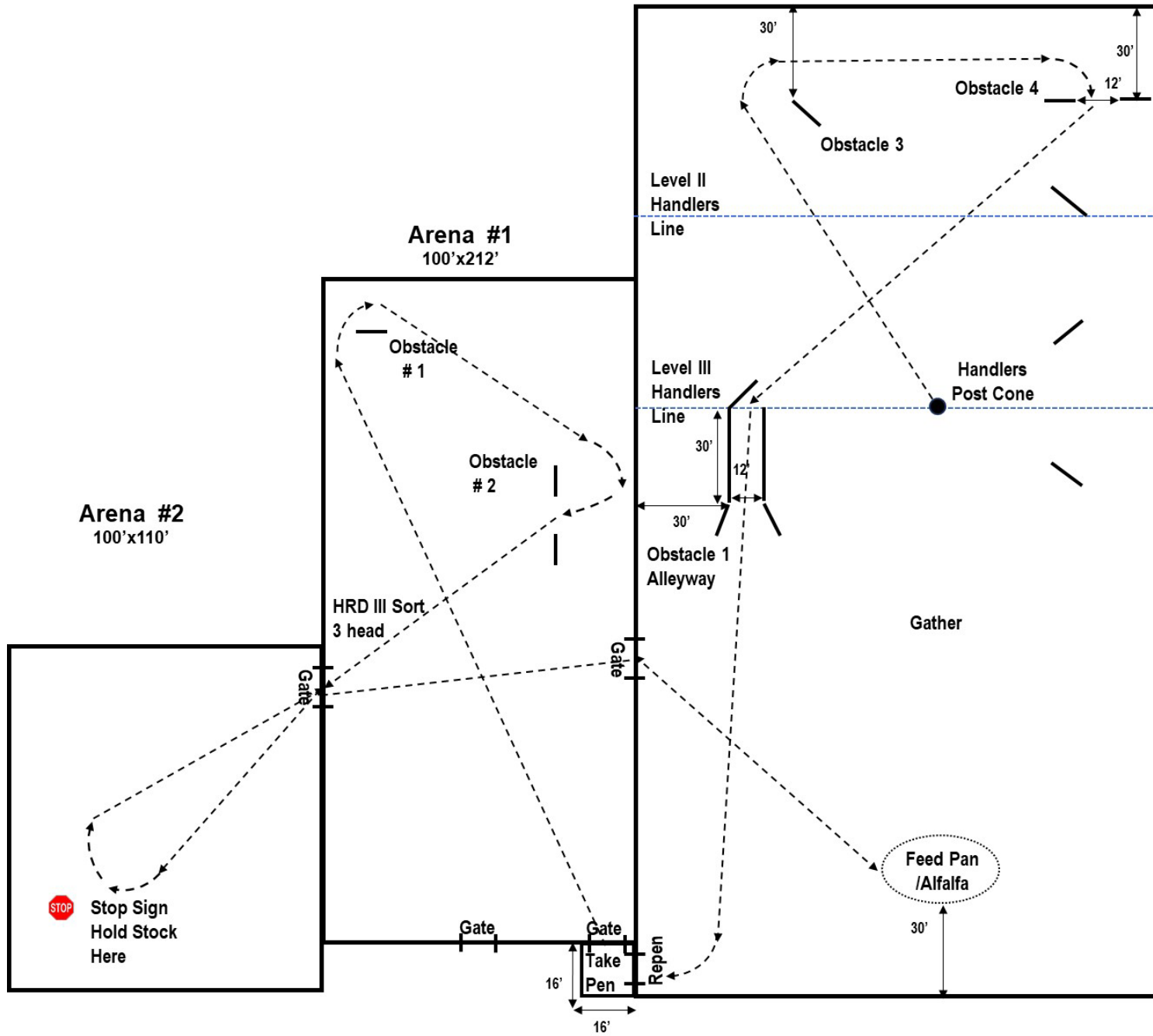
5. Hold: All classes include a hold. The animals are taken to the hold area which is approximately the middle of the bottom half of the arena. The stock are settled and briefly held in place. There is no required position for handler or dog. The judge signals the end of the hold/settle. HTAD I and II handlers then take the stock to the repen. HTAD III handlers proceed with the sort.

6. Sort: The sort is done by HTAD III handlers only. The stock are taken to the Reopen Gate. Any two animals are gate-sorted and repenned. Handlers shall not touch the sheep. A crook, hands or body can be used to block the sheep including use of their dog. Handler cannot shut the gate on a sheep. The sort ends when the gate is closed on the sorted animals.

7. Reopen: The stock are taken to the repen and held a short distance off the gate while it is opened, and then are repenned. For the Gate Sort, the animals that had been left out in the arena are repenned. The run ends when the repen gate is closed after the last animal has exited the arena. Handlers may not enter the Reopen.

AHBA HRD COURSE 2025 DESCRIPTION

Tie Breaker: Best Take Pen, then best Reopen, then Time, then best Obstacle 5

Course Time: TBD maybe 20 minutes

Time starts when the gate for the take pen is opened. The lead is removed before the handler opens the take pen gate except for HRD I handlers who may enter the pen on leash..

All panels are 10' long.

1. Take Pen: From the 16' x 16' take pen, stock are removed and headed into Arena #1 which is 212'x 100'. Open and close gate. HRD I handlers may enter the pen with their dog on leash if the handler chooses, but there must be a pause after the lead is removed before the dog is sent to collect the stock. Handler may move around to assist the dog as needed but may not touch the dog or stock without penalty. HRD II handlers may enter the pen but must remain just inside the gate while the dog moves the stock out of the pen. HRD III handlers may not enter the pen. HRD II and HRD III handlers must enter the pen off lead. Scoring for the Take Pen ends when the stock have exited and the gate is closed to Arena #1.

2. Obstacle 1 : Stock are moved to the northwest left corner panel with a 12' opening from the west side fence and 26' from the north fence. Stock enter to the left of the panel and then around to the right at the back of the panel. All HRD handlers may not enter obstacle but can go up to the opening of the obstacle. Scoring ends when stock have cleared the Obstacle.

3. Obstacle 2: The stock are headed toward the south east and taken to the east side of two panels that are set up parallel to and 35' from the East fence and 60' from the north fence with a 12' opening. Stock enter the panels from the eastside and exit toward the west. All handlers can take the stock up to the panels but handlers may not enter the Obstacle. Scoring ends when stock have cleared the obstacle and are about 20' in front of Arena #2 gate.

4. Arena #2 Gate & Sort: HRD III handlers will gate sort any 4 sheep into Arena #2 with one of those sorted sheep being a solid white.

Close gate. Then reunite the remaining sheep into Arena #2 with the other sorted sheep. HRD II and HRD I handlers will open gate to Arena #2 and take the stock through the gate and then close the gate. Scoring ends when the sheep get halfway down the arena.

5. Stop and Hold Stock: Take stock to Stop Sign and settle stock and hold for a count of 12. Scoring then ends when stock are moved.

6. Arena #3 Gate to Feed Pan: All Handlers will move the stock back through Arena #2 gate and proceed to Arena #3 gate. Open and close all gates. Turn stock to the right or South in Arena #3 and set stock on feed pan 30'north of the South fence. Handlers proceed to Handler's cone at the mid-point of the Arena. Scoring ends when handlers reach the Handlers cone.

7. Gather: HRD III handler and dog start at the cone and handler remains at cone for the gather. HRD II handler sets dog at cone and handler may go halfway to the stock to send. HRD I handler's dog may be taken to a point halfway between the the cone and the stock and then the handler can go to within 15 feet of the stock. Send dog and then stock are taken to right or east of cone then turning left around the back of the cone heading northwest toward Obstacle 3. Scoring ends when stock have cleared the back of the cone and heading left or northwest.

8. Obstacle 3 & Wear/Drive: Stock are driven to the left or northwest toward the North fence and taken around to the left and back of the freestanding panel that is 30' from the North fence and set at a diagonal northwest to southeast. Stock are then turned to the right or east toward Obstacle 4. HRD III handlers remain behind their handler line at the handler's cone and drive the stock around the back of the panel. HRD II handlers may accompany the stock to the HRD II handler's line and then must remain along the line to drive the stock around the back of the panel. HRD I handlers may go up to the panel but cannot go around through the opening of the panel. Scoring ends when the stock have turned East towards Obstacle 4.

9. Obstacle 4: The stock are turned/driven to the East to Obstacle 4 which is a two panel obstacle and is located in the North East corner parallel to the

North fence 30' south from the North Fence. The second panel is perpendicular to the East fence and is located on the East fence. The opening is 10' wide. The stock are moved along the North fence and then turned/driven to the South to enter Obstacle 4. Handlers remain behind their Handler's line except for HTAD I handlers who can move anywhere. Scoring for Obstacle 4 ends when the stock have exited the Obstacle.

10. Obstacle 5: The stock are turned in a southwest direction toward the Alleyway. Alleyway chute is located off the West fence, with the entrance built from the midpoint of the arena 30' south and 30' off the west side of the arena. The alleyway obstacle has a 12 ft. opening with two opposite wings at the entrance. A gate is attached at the rear end of the Alleyway. The stock will enter the rear end of the obstacle and the gate will be fully opened to act as a wing and gate stays open and is not closed. All Handlers can move to any position relative of the Alleyway and shall not go through the obstacle.
